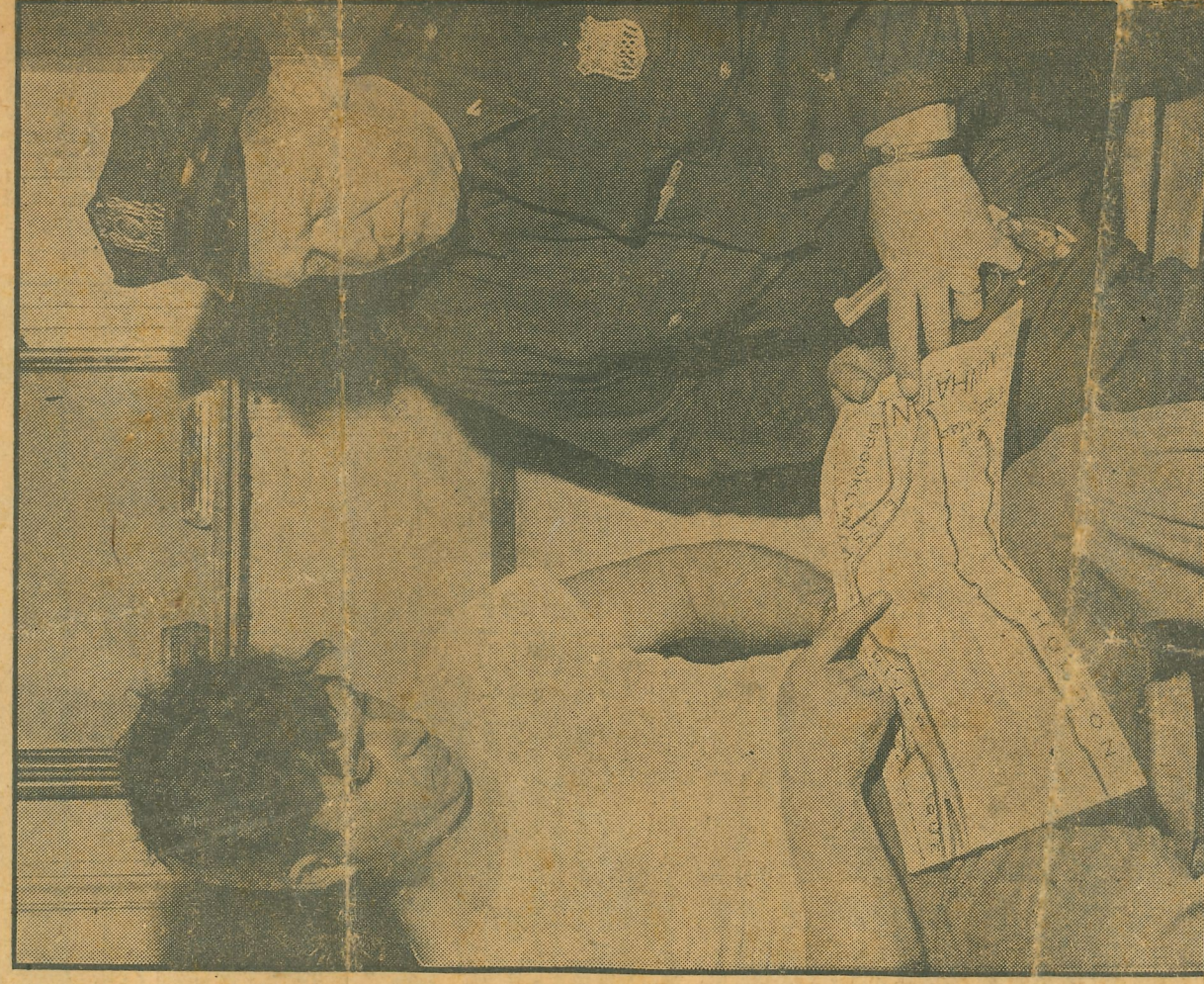

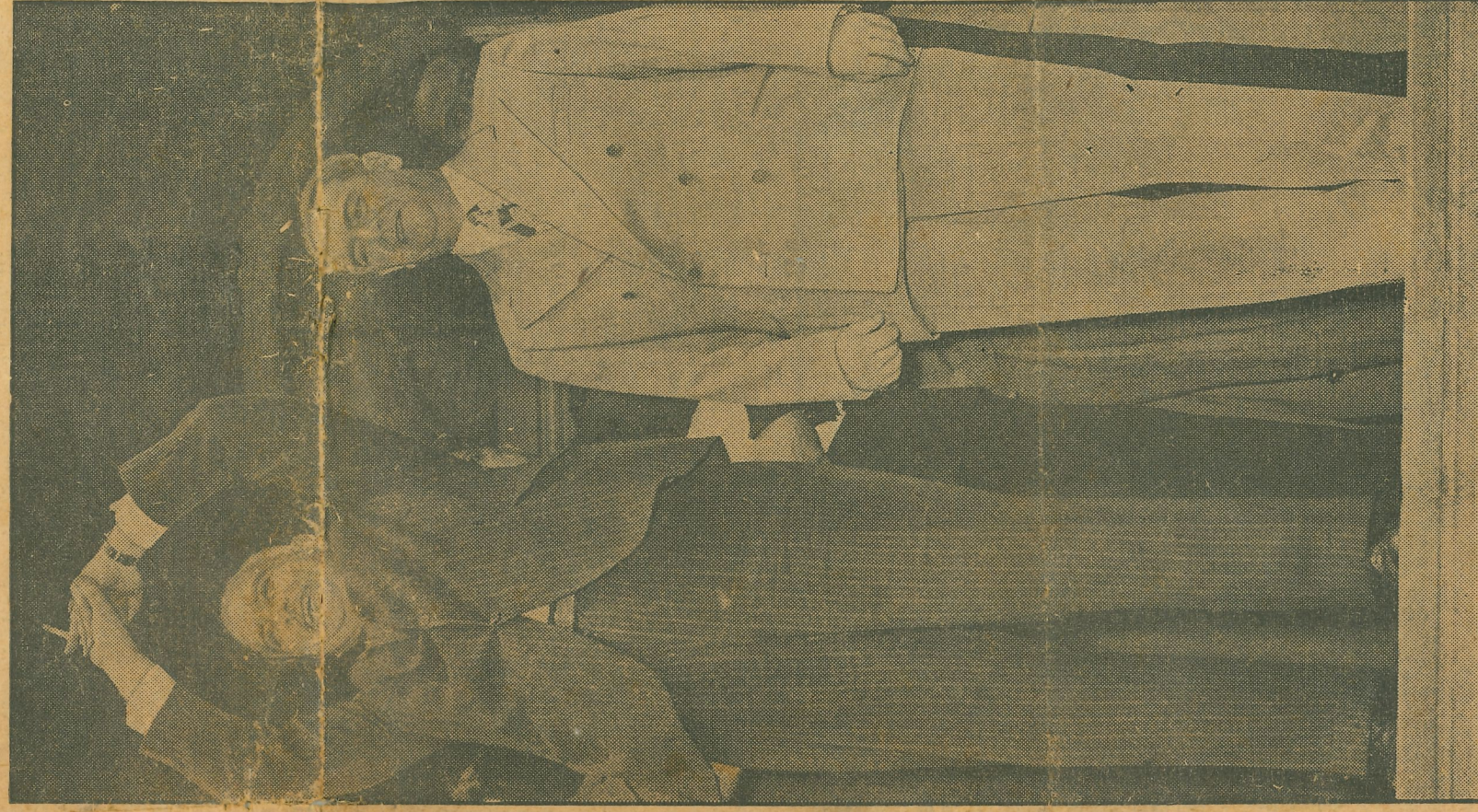


## 'OPERATION STICKUP' . . .
